

2017 Public Affairs Internships for Summer & Fall Semesters U.S. Labor Department - Philadelphia Regional Office of Public Affairs

The <u>U.S. Department of Labor's</u> Public Affairs Internship is open to **high-performing undergraduate juniors and seniors** and **graduate students** in Public Relations and Journalism Master's programs.

To participate, students must be currently enrolled at an accredited college or university. This internship is unpaid.

Students will work in the Regional Office of Public Affairs in Philadelphia. A transit subsidy is provided for interns who commute on SEPTA and PATCO only.

DUTIES INCLUDE:

- Contact regional news media outlets and reporters telephonically or via email to pitch events or garner news coverage
- Develop verbal and written (email) pitches to send to regional media outlets and reporters to pitch events or garner news coverage
- Develop blog ideas, write blogs, and assist regional agency representatives with developing and writing blogs.
- Conduct interviews with DOL and non-DOL representatives and write feature stories and short blurbs for the regional intranet website "Labor Net"
- Take photos at various DOL and other events, and/or take photos of DOL staff for use in feature stories, blogs, and other publications
- Contribute to the planning and execution of internal and external engagement programs and campaigns

REQUIREMENTS:

- Ability to use the internet, social media platforms (ex: Twitter and Facebook), and other online tools and databases (ex: Cision Point) to conduct research about media outlets and media representatives, and to track news coverage on specific or trending topics
- Proficient Use of Associated Press Style writing guidelines to draft news briefs, media advisories, and blogs
- Excellent written and verbal communication skills, and computer skills
- Professional and positive attitude

Students must be able to meet the minimum time commitment, roughly 16 hours/week during the summer and 8-10 hours/week during the fall

HOW TO APPLY: Provide a cover letter, resume, three (3) writing samples (ex: press releases, feature stories or other written articles, well-written school papers), and three (3) references (ex: from current/former professors, academic advisor, or supervisor).

DEADLINE TO APPLY FOR ONE OR BOTH SEMESTERS IS APRIL 28, 2017

Summer internship will start the first week of June. Fall internship will begin around the second week of September.
